

### FRPA S.57 Overview

- Authorization required for construction, maintenance, or rehabilitation of a trail or other recreation facility
  - Applies to public land, outside parks and protected areas
- Legislative authority
  - Section 57 of FRPA & Part 3 of FRR
- Does not confer legal status or designation
  - Analogous to a 'works permit'
- May be used in conjunction with an establishment designation (FRPA s.56)








## FRPA S57 Authorizations

- FRPA s.57 authorizations issued in 2022, 2023 & 2024: 130
- 301 applications received
- Standard maintenance via nearly 400 volunteer Partnership Agreements
  - A lot of maintenance done under Annual Operating plan in PA

Increasing demand for recreation opportunities

- Increase in number of proposals for construction and maintenance
- Complexity of applications and referrals also increasing





### **Current Status**

### Outdated System, Increased Complexity and **Expectations**

RSTBC authorizations policy and system is outdated

- Limited functionality (PDF proposal form, manual tracking, etc.)
- Process inconsistencies (submission process, levels of service, etc.)

The land base is rapidly changing

- Reconciliation, consultation and cooperation with Indigenous peoples
- Overlapping interests of multiple stakeholders
- Commitments to environmental stewardship

Expectations on decisions makers are growing

- Review and adjudication may take longer
- Authorizations may include more conditions



## Improved Approach to Authorizing Construction and Maintenance

### **Key Drivers**

- Address administrative workload pressures
- Enhance service delivery

### **Key Components**


- Modernize Proposal Form
- Provide comprehensive guidance to applicants
- Streamline process for minor complexity projects
- Standardize service with Front Counter BC
- Provide better, centralized tracking using ATS





### FRPA S.56 Overview

- Minister may order establishment of recreation site, recreation trail, interpretive forest
  - Applies to public land, outside parks and protected areas
  - No application process internal process
- Does confer legal status
  - Analogous to a FSR or Park designation
- Allows full suite of tools for management
  - FRR, fees, partnership agreement, enforceable rules





## Establishments across BC

- 6,600 Established Trails
  - 20,000 kilometers of trail
- 1,939 recreation sites
  - Represents 8,831 camp sites
- 12 Interpretive Forest Sites
- How much is enough what is sustainable





## Process Improvements


- Growth has been unsustainable
  - Adding ~ 50 sites and trails / year province wide since 2007
  - Limited growth in staffing and resourcing
- Standard process and elements
- Considerations for resourcingRST and volunteer

   primary use




